In the face of a growing childcare crisis and increased demand for equitable early learning opportunities, Wonderbloom has remained steadfast in its commitment to creating accessible, nurturing spaces for children to explore, learn, and thrive while considering the sustainability of the nonprofit. Through our programs, children have not only developed foundational academic and social skills but also cultivated a lifelong love of the natural world.

One of our proudest achievements this year has been the launch of our Equitable Access Initiative. Funds earned will be invested in an endowment account through Community Foundation of Utah. This will ensure that children from economically vulnerable families can experience the benefits of our nature-based education for many years to come. Along with raising funds for the initiative, we hired a part-time Outreach Coordinator to build community partnerships, interface with diverse families, and recruit families to our program that may benefit from financial assistance. Another great accomplishment was earning the Nature Explore Certification for out Outdoor Classroom and celebrating with a ribbon cutting. Many volunteer hours from the board, parents, and community members created this beautiful learning space for Wonderbloom students. We would not have been able to accomplish this without the generous support of the Garbett Family Foundation and many others.

As we look to the future, we remain committed to growing our programs, reaching more families, and advocating for policies that support nature-based education and equitable access for all children.

Summary


Nonprofit best practices recommend maintaining a spending ratio of **65:20:15** for programs, administration, and fundraising, with the majority of funds directed toward programs. We are proud to report that Wonderbloom exceeded this standard by allocating **86% of our spending to programs**, **11% to administrative costs**, and only **3% to fundraising activities**.

The Childcare Stabilization Grant played a pivotal role in supporting our mission this year. It enabled us to enhance our indoor and outdoor facilities and invest in our dedicated staff through improved compensation and professional development opportunities.


Financial stability is a cornerstone of long-term success. We moved **\$250,000** of net revenue into a money market mutual fund account. Not only will this provide a safeguard of approximately five months of operating expenses, but the growth will be used toward program activities. Additionally, **\$33,000** in net revenue, raised in previous years and earmarked for scholarships, remains in a savings account and will soon be placed in a dedicated investment account to expand our Equitable Access Initiative.

These financial advancements demonstrate our commitment to fiscal responsibility, program excellence, and the sustainability of Wonderbloom's mission.
